1. Read the GENERAL RULES APPLYING TO ALL JUNIOR FAIR EXHIBITORS.
2. 4-H members must exhibit in Section A in order to exhibit additional items in Section B. If the 4-H member is taking the self-determined quilt project then they can enter Section B, Class 16 without entering an item in Section A. Items entered in Section B classes need to show an amount of time and effort equivalent to that of a 4-H project or a work and family life (school) project. Creative arts projects are not entered here.
3. FCCLA members will exhibit in Section B.
4. All 4-H Clothing projects which consist of 2 or more articles such as Ready, Let's Sew or Sports Clothes must be entered in only one class.
5. Exhibits must be in place before Saturday the first day of the fair, and remain in place until official release time. To receive premium, members must bring their exhibit to the Junior Fair Building during judging on September 8th; between 6-9 pm, Wednesday or Thursday prior to fair; or between 1-9 pm Friday prior to fair.
6. 4-H Clothing projects will be judged in summer judging for awards and placing.
7. Those not participating in the July judging can have their project judged on Saturday, September 8th for grade and premium. These projects are eligible for outstanding rosettes. Open Class Clothing (Section B) will be interview judged Saturday, September 8.
8. A beginner, intermediate and advanced clothing construction award will be selected at summer judging for projects in Section A. Categories are determined by the listing in the current Family 4-H Guide.
9. Bring completed project book to interview judging.
