# Tournaments And Contests!

### **PEDAL TRACTOR PULL**

**DIRECTOR-IN-CHARGE - HAL CLASE**

Saturday, September 15 at 9:00 a.m. –  
registration starts at 8:30 a.m.,  
location - Junior Fair Show Arena

The Buckeye Valley FFA Alumni will supervise and conduct the contest for the Delaware County Agricultural Society. All decisions of the committee conducting the contest will be final. Pedal Tractors are furnished by the Buckeye Valley FFA Alumni.

#### **Contest Rules:**

1. Contestants may be boys or girls 12 years of age or less the day of the contest.
2. Contestants must weigh at least 30 pounds and not more than 105 pounds. Contestants will be divided into 5 weight classes and each boy or girl must weigh in the day of the contest.
  - a. Class 1: 91-105 pounds
  - b. Class 2: 76-90 pounds
  - c. Class 3: 61-75 pounds
  - d. Class 4: 46-60 pounds
  - e. Class 5: 30-45 pounds
3. All contestants must wear shoes.
4. All contestants will be given 3 consecutive chances to get the sled moving from the starting line. No re-pulls. Once the lead has moved this

will be the contestant's pull. When chain clears the ground the pull starts.

5. No standing up to pedal. Daylight seen between the seat of the tractor and puller ends the pull.
6. The pulling tractor must stay within the established pulling lane. The distance will be measured from the starting line to that point where the tractor crossed the boundary.
7. One parent or guardian may accompany the contestant inside the arena to coach and encourage the contestant during the pull as long as they are on the ground and at track side.
8. No hooking feet under the tractor pedals will be permitted.
9. No backing up or jerking of the skid chain will be permitted.
10. Stopped forward motion ends the pull.
11. Parent or guardian must enter child and sign liability release form. Child must be present to be weighed at that time.
12. The liability release signature releases the Buckeye Valley FFA Alumni plus the Delaware Agricultural Society from any liability claims in case of accidents.
13. The Pull committee will conduct a pull-off in case of ties and has the right to rule and settle any disputes.
14. Registration will start at 8:30 a.m. with class 1 being the first pull class. Class 1 will start pulling at 9:00 a.m. and will be followed by classes 2, 3, 4 and 5. Registration will continue during the contest for the next scheduled classes, but no additional registration will be taken for a class once the class has started pulling.

#### ***Safety Precautions***

Spectators must remain outside the pulling area.

#### ***Awards***

Each participant will receive a participation ribbon. The first and second place finishers in each class will receive a trophy.
